THE DUKE OF EDINBURGH AWARD

FROM TERM 1

Caloundra City Private School is excited to offer The Duke of Edinburgh Award through our school in 2022.

The Duke of Edinburgh Award Scheme consists of three levels – Bronze, Silver and Gold. Within each level there are four sections: Service, Skill, Physical Recreation and Adventurous Journey. A residential project is also included in the Gold Level. A handout with more details will be given to participants and their parents.

Students who complete Bronze Level are credited one point towards their Year 11 and 12 school certificates, the Queensland Certificate of Education (QCE), Silver Level is also one point and Gold Level contributes two points. All three awards completed gives students four points towards their QCE. (This is same amount of points as a senior subject, studied in Years 11 and 12.)

This is a whole year commitment for the students. Adventurous Journeys are organised by the students in conjunction with the staff involved. Service, Skill and Physical Recreation sections are organised by students in their own time. Each of the three sections requires about one hour per week. Participants will meet each fortnight during lunch in the RBH PE room on Thursdays.

Registration fees of \$185 for Bronze level + \$120 each additional level. The School subsidises 50% of Gold Award fees. The cost of the Adventurous Journeys varies depending on the type and length of the journey/expedition.

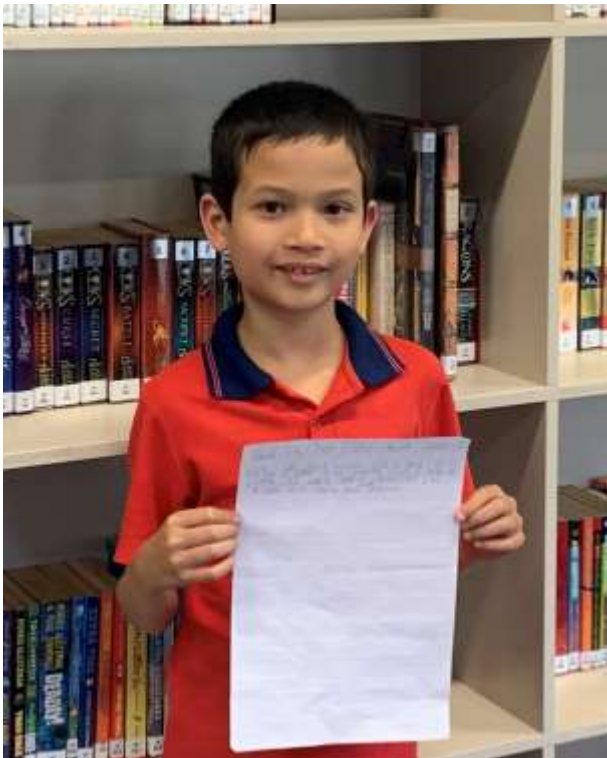

Mr Job Cran is a professional working musician who has been composing, performing, producing and releasing music for over 15 years. He has worked in a range of recording studios, played many shows with his various bands, produced music videos and released numerous singles, EPs and albums with various groups in a range of musical genres including rock, metal, acoustic, pop, blues, funk, classical and progressive music. He is a virtuosic guitarist and has featured at the Guitar Masters series of shows. You can find his music on all platforms (including Spotify/Apple Music/Bandcamp etc.) as well as music videos on YouTube.

Job has been teaching specialist music for 13 years at a range of schools, including ensembles, individual lessons, group lessons, extra-curricular programs (Rock Band, Guitar groups, production), audio visual technologies and classroom music as well as delivering Cert IV in Music Industry. Lessons are highly individualised, and students are guided through a set of musical goals in order to develop musicianship, confidence, authority on their chosen instrument, a wide and varied repertoire and technique.

As a recording artist, Job has a strong focus on composition in tandem with music theory and excels at helping students to discover their musical voice. Aspects covered during lessons include learning technique/theory through songs, basic through to highly advanced hand skills and techniques, rhythmic elements and development of timing, ear training and learning to “play by ear”, understanding how to read written music whether standard music notation or tablature, composing, arranging and producing music.

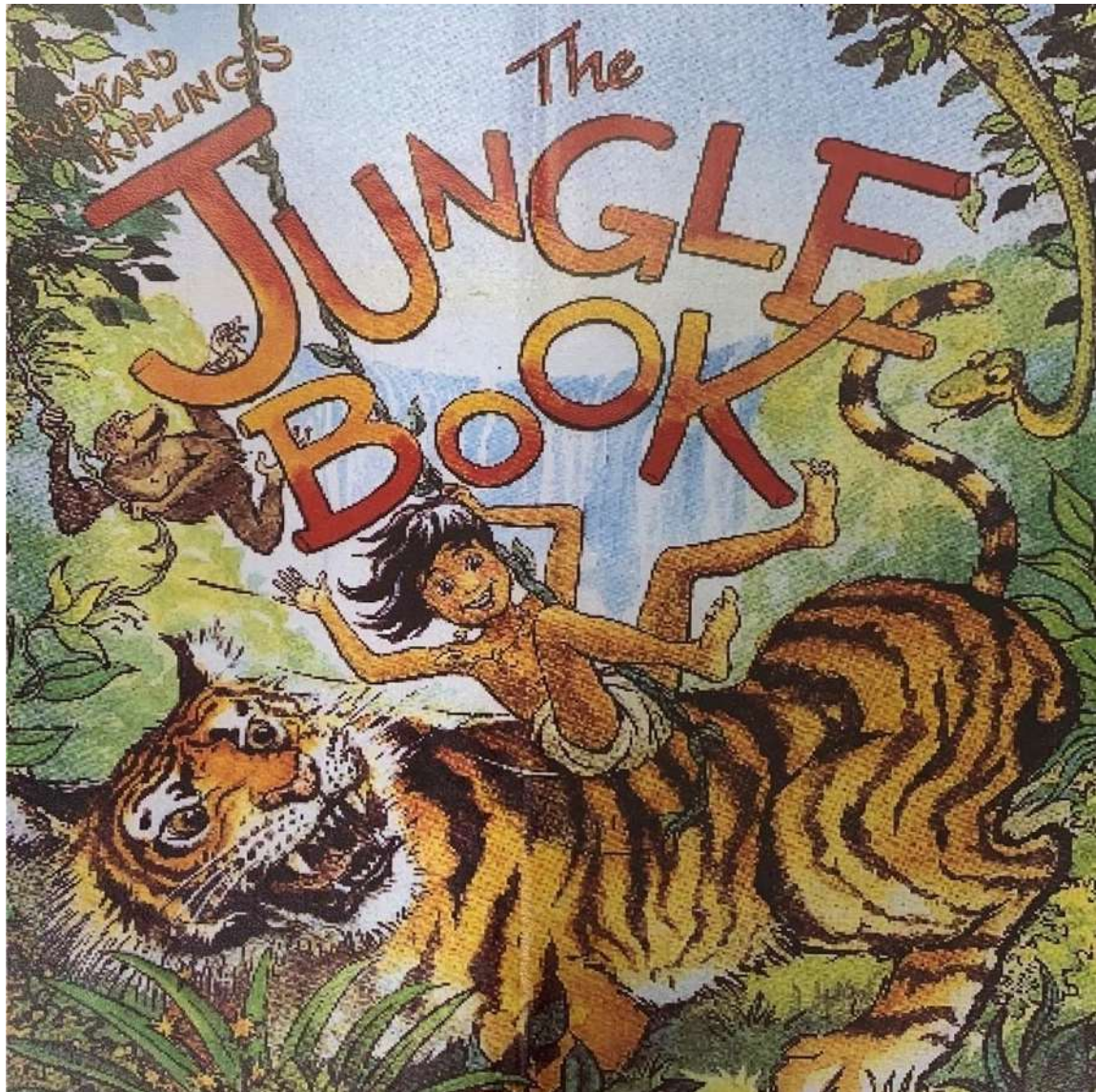
