Pelican's Nest Early Learning Centre

Pelican's Nest Early Learning Centre starts your child's learning journey from six weeks old with highly qualified Early Childhood specialists.

We are passionate advocates for early childhood development and strive to provide a holistic, nurturing, learning environment where children feel safe, connected and happy. Our programs are based on the National Early Years Learning Framework and our centre also provides a Queensland Government Approved Kindergarten Program.

Our passionate educators provide an immersive Nature Play program at Pelican's Nest. Outdoor play and experiences, such as bush walks, feeding the chickens and ducks and growing plants in the permaculture garden enables our educators to teach your children environmental awareness and sustainability in a practical way. Along with this, we run a strong numeracy and literacy program that leverages the resources of CCPS, giving your child the best start to their learning journey.

The Centre is open 51 weeks of the year excluding public holidays. The hours of operation are from 6.30am to 6.30pm.

Our Centre has been designed to provide outstanding facilities and resources for young children.

Our Early Learning Centre will provide a

developmental curriculum where each individual student's program is based on individual interest, progress, readiness and learning style.

This is achieved through the following programs and curriculum:

Junior School

Our Kindergarten program is designed to assist with a smooth transition to Prep. The program is based on the developmental needs of each child. Learning experiences are carefully planned and reflect a time in the lives of students when they are growing and learning rapidly.

Preparatory

The Prep program is designed to assist smooth transition into Year 1. The program focuses on students learning the early foundations of literacy and numeracy while continuing to establish lifelong social skills. 

Kindergarten to Year 6 Curriculum

Students can expect the following from the curriculum at Caloundra City Private School:

In the Junior School, students learn about English, Mathematics, HASS (History and Geography), Science, Japanese, Art, Music, Physical Education and Technologies within integrated units of work to provide context and heighten interest. Many activities have a lens of awareness and development of our identified 24 character strengths. Catering for the needs of students, the Junior School has a variety of extension and support groups taught by the classroom teachers. The school also has an Inclusive Learning Co-ordinator/teacher who works with teachers and directly with students to address the needs of all students including those with a disability.

Students in the Junior School are mentored by older students and have the opportunity to mentor younger students through a range of programs including our Student Representative Council, Science buddies, Year 6 leadership program to name a few.



Caloundra City Private School provides each child the advantage of a K – 12 campus, where there is a coordinated transition from one part of the school to the next.

Our school is a safe, happy and exciting learning environment, where students are encouraged to strive for their best in all areas of school life.

The Senior School provides a strong foundation for your child's future life as a confident and capable adult, who is able to contribute to society in a meaningful and purposeful way. The nurturing environment at Caloundra City Private School, supports, engages, extends and challenges students' learning at every stage of their development in the Senior School. The holistic approach to education is a significant feature of the Senior School and this is achieved by providing a wide range of curriculum, sporting, cultural and leadership opportunities at every Year level. The students are allocated to a House and attend Vertical House groups (Years 7-12) and are involved in numerous Inter House competitions.

Life Skills Program

Each Year level has a specially devised pastoral care, Life Skills Program, which is designed to address a range of issues from peer pressure, to study techniques and time management strategies, to relationship building, self esteem, healthy body image, to issues of drugs and responsible citizenship. Caloundra City Private School has a comprehensive anti bullying program, which gives students appropriate strategies for dealing effectively with any bullying behaviours. The School does not tolerate bullying behaviours and our core values of care and respect for self and others underpin our Life Skills Program.

All Year levels will have the opportunity to participate in annual outdoor education camps. These camps are designed to develop team work, friendships, resilience, leadership skills and problem solving and provide physical and intellectual challenges, and a strong sense of community and spirit.

Integrated Technology

Our students are well prepared for the Digital Revolution and Caloundra City Private School provides the essential digital technology skills which are integrated in all subject areas.



Teachers provide a learning environment that enables all students to achieve their potential.

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UNIVERSAL IN

Intermediate Studies -Years 7 to 8

There is a strong academic focus in the Intermediate Years from Years 7 to 8, where the number of teachers is minimised to help each student transition from the Junior to the Senior School.

Year 7 and 8 mark a defining stage in a young person's educational and developmental journey as the end of primary schooling and the student embarks on secondary education. Caloundra City Private School recognises that the transition from Primary School to High School is an exciting time for students as they commence the next stage in a lifelong educational journey.

The focus in Year 7 and 8 is to create a learning environment that is supportive and appropriate for these students.

We aim to create an environment and academic program that encourages and supports the intellectual, physical, social and psychological growth of all students. Growth in each of these areas does not occur in isolation or at a steady and predictable rate, therefore we provide an atmosphere that encourages supportive studentteacher relationships and a child-centred approach to learning.



Senior Phase of Learning -Year 9 and 10

Year 9 provides the first step in the senior phase of learning at CCPS and is structured so that students continue in foundation core subjects.

In Years 9 and 10 students are introduced to new and exciting subject offerings, as well as new academic routines.

Students are able to pick from a list of elective subjects including:

- Digital Technology and Design
- Enterprise Education
- Japanese
- Media Arts
- Music
- Visual Arts

Students in Year 10 have the opportunity to do a week of Work Experience, as part of the Career Education Program and begin their preparation for the Senior Phase of Learning. From Term 4, students begin their Years 11 subjects.



Senior Phase of Learning -Year 11 and 12

Students will choose from a range of subjects based on their abilities, interests and future career ambitions.

In Years 11 and 12, students follow the guidelines for senior studies set by the Queensland Curriculum and Assessment Authority (QCAA). In doing this, students may choose an ATAR Pathway (university entrance score) and all students work towards achieving their Queensland Certificate of Education (QCE). The qualification confirms the achievement of young people achieving a significant amount of learning at an agreed standard, including literacy and numeracy.

The QCE recognises a broad range of learning that caters to the diverse needs and aspirations of all. This broad range offers flexibility, but also requires specified standards of achievement. Having a set amount of learning and a set standard lets students know what they have to aspire to, and it lets the community know what is expected to attain the QCE. The QCE sends a clear message that it represents successful achievements in a significant amount of learning, and so provides students with a more valued passport to further education, training and employment.

All students complete course studies in General English and either General Mathematics or Mathematical Methods.

Electives

Subject options for students in Years 11 and 12 include:

- Biology
- Business
- Chemistry
- Design
- Music
- Television and New Media
- Legal Studies
- Modern History
- Physical Education
- Physics
- Visual Arts in Practice

Distance Education

Students are also able to study other subjects with the School of Distance Education. University subjects, as well as traineeships, apprenticeships and other certificate courses are also supported by the school in partnership with other providers. This includes Headstart programmes, through Universtity of the Sunshine Coast, which allows school-aged students to advance their study skills and gain credit toward university subjects.

















Co-Curricular Activities

At Caloundra City Private School we have a large number of cocurricular activities that link to the school's priorities.

Wellbeing

Wellbeing and Pastoral Care is a core focus at Caloundra City Private School.

A holistic focus on each child's wellbeing is embedded across all aspects of the school, starting with our Pelican's Nest and City Stars Kindergarten students, right through our Junior and Senior School students.

The Wellbeing@CaloundraCity is currently being rolled out via several means, including:

- New social and emotional education initiatives interwoven through all aspects of the students daily lives at the school.
- Student Diary and Daily Planner which has been designed specifically for the School with Mick Walsh and the Learning Curve group.
- The use of quiet time and reflection throughout the students and staff days.
- Linking with Wellbeing organisations such as The Institute of Positive Education, Positive Education Schools Association and Action for Happiness Organisation and
- A renewed importance placed on education 'out of doors'.

The PERMA-H Model

The Wellbeing@CaloundraCity framework intertwines the Caloundra City Private School core values with Martin Seligman's (2011) PERMA-H Model of Wellbeing, highlighting the importance placed on each individual's journey of emotional and physical wellbeing at our school.

From Kindergarten - Year 12

Wellbeing@CaloundraCity is a Kindergarten to Year 12 program centred on the pathways to Wellbeing in education, supporting students, staff, parents and our broader school community to lead meaningful and fulfilling lives. The program aims to foster an environment where the entire school community can grow and flourish. This is realised through the deliberate development and enhancement of traits and elements which act as the building blocks for a positive life, focusing on physical and emotional safety, pro-social values of the school, social and emotional learning, a supportive and caring school community, a strength based approach to wellbeing, and developing a sense of purpose and a healthy lifestyle for all members of the school community.



The Arts

Music

Music is highly valued at our school. It fosters creative, artistic, emotional, and expressive communication. Music develops students' ability to be creative, an adaptable thinker and problem solver and holds a significant and special place in the everyday life of all cultures and societies.

Music classes begin in Prep and is part of our curriculum through to Year 12.

We offer a diverse range of musical experiences with our music classroom boasting enough musical resources and instruments for each child during their lessons. From Prep to Year 6 students will experience playing drums, keyboards, and guitars. Students work towards reading and writing music through singing, playing, and performing.

Specialist Music

In addition to classroom Music lessons, students can participate in private music tutoring lessons, as part of our Co-Curricular offerings. Students will be guided through a set of musical goals to develop musicianship, confidence, and authority on their chosen instrument. Aspects covered include advanced hand skills and techniques, rhythmic elements and development of timing, ear training, understanding how to read written music, composing, arranging, and producing music.

Musical Productions

Musical productions bring together our school community giving students the opportunity to shine and showcase their many talents. All students are invited to participate by taking on various roles, whether it is starring in the performance or helping with stage production, costumes, media, or lighting.

Visual Arts

Visual Arts includes the fields of art, craft and design and involves students making and responding to artworks, drawing on the world as a source of ideas. Students create visual representations that communicate, challenge, and express their own and others' ideas as artist and audience. They engage with the knowledge of visual arts, develop skills, techniques, and processes, and use materials as they explore a range of forms, styles and contexts. Through Visual Arts, students also learn to reflect critically on their own experiences and responses to the work of artists, craftspeople, and designers. Our school participates in the annual Young Archie competition a national art prize hosted and judged by the Art Gallery of New South Wales, Sydney.















Sport, Health and Physical Education (HPE) and Outdoor Education

Sport, HPE and Outdoor Education at Caloundra City Private School caters to all age groups and abilities.

Our primary focus is on participation which builds students' self-esteem and confidence in addition to improving their physical and social skills. These abilities contribute to the culture, standard and ambiance of the school.

Our Sport program for Students in Prep to Year 6 is aimed at increasing students' fundamental motor development skills through the experience of various modified games. In the later years, we focus on increasing students' knowledge, understanding and skill level in various modified games. These programs also assist the development of students' interpersonal, communication and co-operation skills as well as encouraging sportsmanship. In addition to these sporting programs we run:

- Beach Skills and Surf Safety lessons
- Swimming lessons
- Bike Education and Cycle Skills (Year 3 to 5)

Students in Years 7 to 10 participate in a weekly dedicated sports afternoon designed to encourage participation in various sports, allow students to be active in sports with their peers and ensure that students are achieving the recommended amount of physical activity per week.

Sport & HPE Program

Students in Years 7 to 10 participate in one forty-five minute theory lesson and one ninetyminute practical lesson per week. All theoretical components co-relate to practical lessons. The students' main focus during practical lessons is to exercise spatial awareness, communication, co-ordination and to increase their broad base of skills required for participation in a variety of sports.

Outdoor Education

At Caloundra City Private School students are given the opportunity to learn valuable life skills, outside of the classroom. Outdoor education forms a core part of our wellbeing program for students. Camps, activities and expeditions are designed to challenge students mentally and physically, disconnect from devices and the hustle and bustle of day to day life. Students detox from all social pressures and reconnect with their thoughts and feelings in an unpredictable environment that can be testing and challenging. These programs are optional; however, they are greatly beneficial to student independence, resilience and their overall holistic development.

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We foster a supportive and positive environment to encourage physical activity participation and enjoyment.

Facilities

Caloundra City Private School is set on 11 beautiful hectares in Pelican Waters, on the Sunshine Coast, Queensland.

We are ideally positioned just minutes from the Pumicestone Passage and pristine beaches of Caloundra.

Our school boasts modern, state-of-theart facilities to support and enrich teaching and learning and our natural surrounds are incorporated into our teaching and learning practices.

Respect

We teach and instil the value of respect. Respect for self, for others and for the community beyond the classroom. We encourage students to treat and value everyone equally and work hard to inspire positive changes in outlook and behaviours.

Developing within all students, the personal qualities and attributes of honesty, empathy, and respect for self and for others. Students are expected to act with social, moral and ethical integrity at School and in their personal lives and to take responsibility for their own actions.

Our Houses

Caloundra City Private School has four Houses

Henzell, Ford, McLean and Munns are the four houses of our School. These houses were named in honour of the founding families of our School.



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Henzell

Henzell house is notably named after the Henzell family, owners of Henzells Agency, the longest operating independent agency on the Sunshine Coast.

The Henzell family have played a major role in the history and development of the Caloundra area shaping entire suburbs including Pelican Waters.

The Henzells are a founding family of CCPS, generously donating the 11 hectares of land the school is situated on, as well as funding for the construction of facilities and Pelican's Nest Early Learning Centre.

The great legacy of Henzells Agency started from humble beginnings with Roy Henzell Senior establishing the agency in 1935. In 1946 he purchased a huge undeveloped 810 – hectare piece of land at Golden Beach for 200 pounds. That piece of land is now known as Pelican Waters.

Since Roy Henzell Senior's passing in 1961, Henzells Agency has been passed down three generations through his son - Bevan Henzell, his wife Judy Henzell and their children. Roy Henzell Senior's daughter Joan Ford was also involved in the family business. The family's long history and love for Caloundra and its community saw the emerging need to provide the growing estate of Pelican Waters and Caloundra area with a leading, non-denominational school.

Caloundra City Private School was opened in 2005 and is operated on a not-for-profit basis. The Henzell building of the School is named after this founding family who remain committed to a bright, thriving future for the school.



Ford

Ford house is proudly named after Joan Ford and the Ford family. Born in 1924 Joan Ford was the daughter of Roy Henzell Senior who established Henzells Agency in 1935.

Joan married Verdon Ford in 1949 and her husband soon became a partner in Henzells Agency. Like her father, Joan studied accountancy.

Joan was a strong advocate for the Caloundra region and a partner in the land development side of the Henzells Agency. When her brother Bevan passed away in 1982, Joan took on a more active role in the family business.

A mother of four sons, Joan was well-known on the Sunshine Coast for her charity work, contribution to the real estate industry and succession of Henzells Agency and her work in the Anglican Church and Zonta, an international global organization of professionals empowering women worldwide. Joan Ford Park and Joan Ford Bridge in Pelican Waters are named in her honour.

Caloundra City Private School's Joan Ford Story Telling room, located in the school's library and the Ford building of the School are also in memory of Joan and the Ford family's generous donation of land and funds to the establishment of the School.

Joan passed away in 2008, her son Dr Jeff Ford remains a director of the School's Board.



McLean

The McLean house pays tribute to Judy Henzell's maiden name. Judy was born in 1928 in Maleny. In 1949 she married Bevan Henzell, son of Roy Henzell Senior and together they had four children - Mary, Roy, Anne and Kate. Her husband Bevan was well liked and respected in the Caloundra community and when he passed away in 1961, Judy Henzell ensured the legacy and success of the Henzell Agency continued. Working in partnership with her sister-in-law and good friend Joan Ford, Judy Henzell was passionate about giving back to the community. Joan and Judy were pioneering women who shared common interests in travel, family, education and playing a hands-on role in shaping, planning, and developing suburbs of Caloundra, including Pelican Waters.

Judy Henzell and the Ford family generously donated land and funds to establish and Caloundra City Private School. In 2008, Caloundra City Private School opened Pelican's Nest Early Learning Centre. The addition of this facility to the school was a result of Judy Henzell's vision and generosity. She saw the need for a quality early learning service in the area and a place for children in the community to start their learning journey and carry right through to graduation of high school.



Munns

Munns house is named in honour of Cec and Noelene Munns. Cec and his wife Noelene were fundamental in establishing Caloundra City Private School. Without their expertise in the bureaucratic requirements to successfully establish an independent school, Caloundra City Private School may not exist today.

Cec Munns was the founding Principal of John Paul College in 1982, the first ecumenical school in Queensland. In 1995 Cec Munns was awarded an Order of Australia Medal for his services to education.

With experience in founding and leading one of Queensland's largest independent schools, Cec was sought by the Henzell and Ford families to oversee the planning, preparation, educational specifications, and accreditation approval phases involved in establishing a new independent school in Pelican Waters.

With assistance from his wife Noelene, the submissions for the establishment of our school were successful and Caloundra City Private School opened in 2005.

Cec Munns remained Foundation Chairman of the School Board providing expert strategic direction up until 2008. Both Cec and Noelene, started their careers as teachers and were passionate about the education system. Mrs Munns was a strong supporter of music and the arts and helped organise Caloundra City Private School's first Arts Alive festival. Noelene Munns passed away in 2010 and is survived by Cec, their three children and grandchildren. The Munns building of Caloundra City Private School is named in tribute to Cec and Noelene Munns and their contribution as a founding family of our School.
